Two summer day camps - one for grades 4th-6th as of 1/1/21 and one for junior high (grades 6th-8th) - will be held at the Extension office. Registration is now open. Completed forms and fees (\$40) are due by April 30, or until full. Space is limited.

Activities planned for the Juniors 4-H Day Camp (for grades 4th-6th, June 14-18) include archery (weather permitting), arts & crafts, engineering challenges, gardening and backyard STEM.

Activities planned for the Junior High Survival Skills Day Camp (for grades 6th-8th, June 28-July 1) include outdoor survival skills, orienteering, wildlife, and archery (weather permitting).

We are unable to offer overnight camping this year. So, the Clyde Austin 4-H Camp Traveling Road Show is coming to Hamilton County. This one-day event is for grades 4th-8th and will be offered on July 8 (location TBA). Registration fee is \$40. Junior High 4-H portfolios are due by April 12; Senior High portfolios are due by May 3. Sign up for a portfolio workshop now to get information on completing yours!

4-H portfolios are your CV (*curriculum vitae* - a summary of experience and skills) of the activities and events you have done in your 4-H project area. They contain information on your activities both through 4-H and through other venues.
