
Enjoy a fun week at Camp Clyde Austin in Greeneville, TN. Activities include swimming, fishing, geocaching, horses, and trips to the

2023 4-H Beekeeping Essay ContestEntries due March 15



The Beekeeping Essay Contest allows 4-H'ers to use their writing and research skills in developing an essay on a beekeeping-related topic. Cash awards are available to winners on the national and state level. This contest is sponsored by the Foundation for the Preservation of Honeybees (click on the image above to learn more). All essays are to be submitted to beessay@utk.edu. The submission deadline is scheduled for March 15, 2023.

2023 Topic: The Importance of Beeswax

Although honey bees are much-beloved for honey, bees also produce beeswax that can be used in many ways. For this essay, a 4-H student should discuss why beeswax is so important to the hive (it's a pantry, it's a nursery, it's the

dance floor), but also discuss their favorite way to use beeswax outside the hive. Photos of candles, soaps, or lip balms that are made to show the 4-H'er's skill in using beeswax are welcomed as are recipes or brief instructions.
