Project finalists, 4-H All-Stars, 4-H alumni, and volunteers gathered from across the state. This year was very special, as it marked the Centennial anniversary of Tennessee 4-H Roundup!

Vol State initiations take place at Tennessee 4-H Roundup. Vol State is the highest level of recognition for a 4-H'er and is awarded to 11th and 12th graders who are nominated by their 4-H Agent and who are members of 4-H Honor Club and All Stars.

In addition to being inducted into Vol State at 4-H Roundup, Logan Johnson won an award for his project interview and also won a trip to National 4-H Congress! Logan's thoughts on Roundup:
