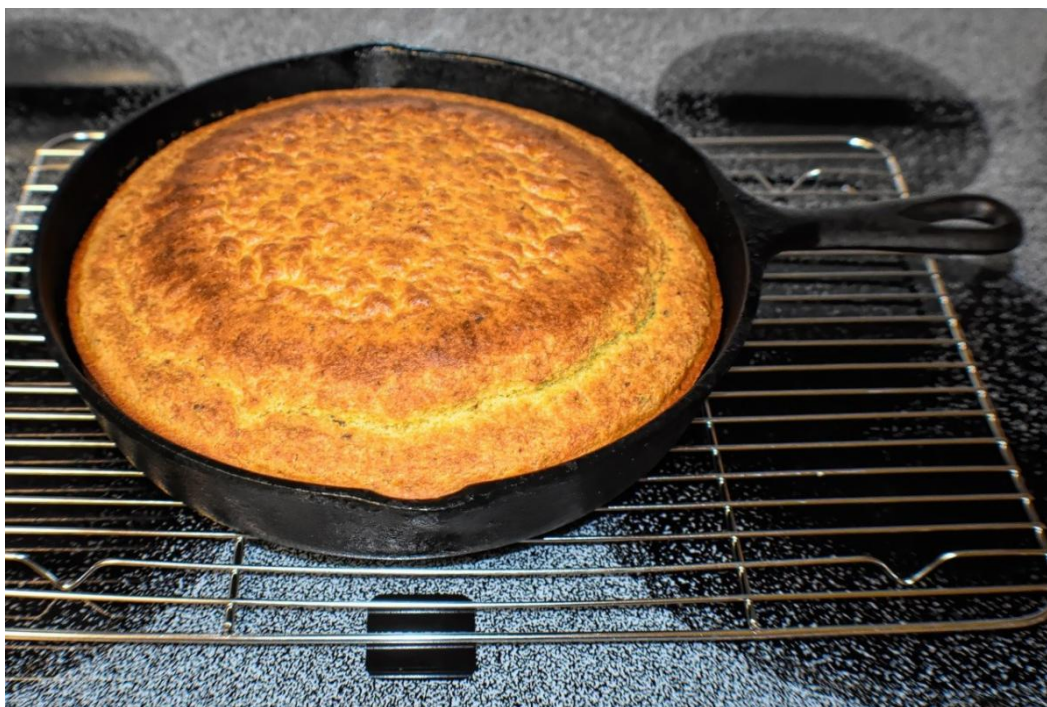

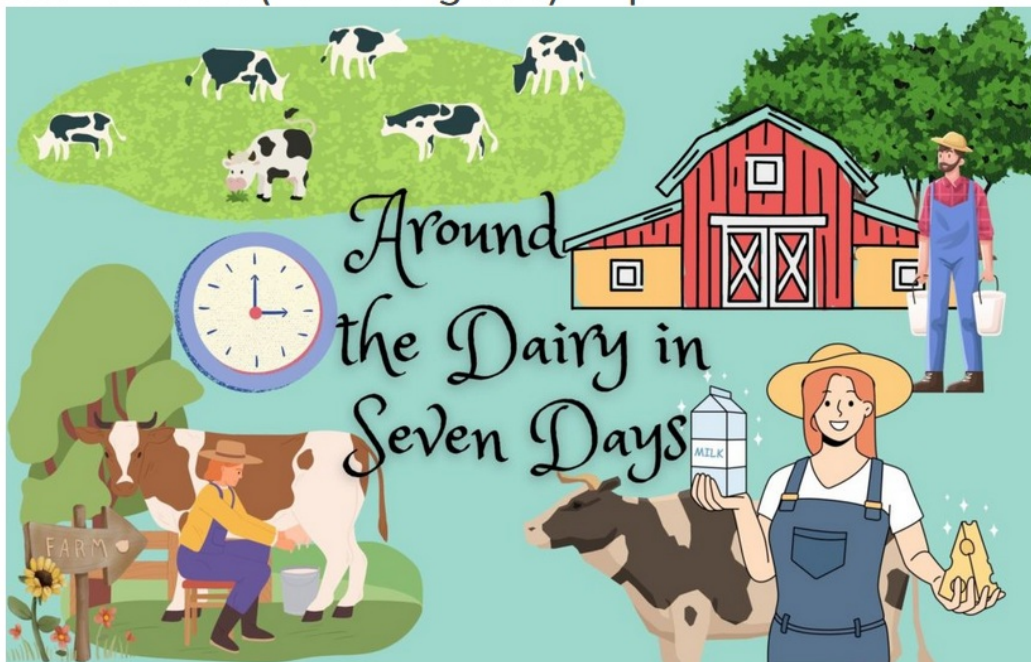

Dairy Poster Contest

Enter by April 15

The Dairy Poster contest is sponsored by The Dairy Alliance. Students learn about dairy farming and the benefits of dairy products and create a poster (on posterboard or on the computer) to turn in to the Extension Office by April. Posters created online must be saved as a jpg and emailed to HamiltonCounty4H@tennessee.edu. Use 14 x 22 posterboard (horizontal) for a regular poster entry. Posters must use the theme for the year, which is selected by The Dairy Alliance. The 2024 theme is **“May The Dairy Be With You.”** All dairy posters (both on posterboard and digital) are due to the Extension Office by April 15.
