





4-H Day Camp July 1-2 at the Extension Office Grades 4th - 6th



4-H Day Camp for Hamilton County youth who have completed 4th, 5th, or 6th grade will be held July 1-2 at the Extension Office. The focus will be trying out activities from multiple 4-H project areas, to help youth in 4-H determine their project area for the next year.

Activities will include archery, gardening, creative arts, communications, wildlife, consumer economics, food science,

nutrition/health/fitness, and more. The camp will be held 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Cost is \$20. To register, complete a **600A Activity and Event Acceptance form** and return it to the Extension Office with day camp fee. Day campers must be enrolled in 4-H in Hamilton County. Forms and fees must be received in the Office by June 24. Space is limited.



4-H Mane Attraction Horse Club meets June 3 at 6:30


