

It's Chick Chain Time in Tennessee!

Register by February 20. Youth in grades 4th-12th in Hamilton County can learn how to raise poultry and take home 12 chicks to raise by participating in 4-H Chick Chain. The cost is \$60.

Participants will bring three hens to the County Fair in November for the 4-H Chick Chain Show and Auction, with auction proceeds split between the 4-H'er and the program. Students who live in the city limits of Chattanooga will receive 8 chicks, to comply with city code.

4-H Horse Club


Meets Monday, February 2 at 6:30 p.m.

4-H Summer Camps!


